The new basketball season started for the club with our underage squads in action away to UL Huskies.

Our U14 and U16 girls were very impressive in their North Munster league games as they set out on the road to AICC qualification for next April.

Our U14 girls showed signs of ring rustiness in the early moments of their game with UL scoring the first two baskets to open up an early 4-0 lead. However our girls soon settled and went in at the end of the first quarter 8-6 ahead. Our second quarter unit extended this lead out to 23-12 at the interval. Our girls with their strong five on court in the third quarter outscored their opponents by 14 to 1. The final quarter was about getting players on the court with the result no longer in doubt. The result was all the more impressive as the girls went into the game without first choice point guard Orla Zundel who missed the game through injury. Hazel Dineen had her best game for some time scoring 12 points. Amy Higgins dominated our defensive boards doing a lot of unseen work and contributing 8 points in another impressive outing. However the star of the show was surely Aoife Morrissey who scored an incredible 34 points despite sitting out large parts of the game.

It is always an anxious and exciting time when our U10 girls take to the court for their first basketball game. This year's team were a revelation on court with the team scoring heavily in each of the 4 quarters. These girls will be in action again in two weeks time and we are already looking forward to see them play. The 10 girls on duty last Saturday were Grace, Claire, Alice, Jade, Isabelle, Grainne, Sarah, Daria, Kaylah and Molly.

The club have big numbers at U12s and U13s this season and will be developing these players over the next couple of seasons before they get into the competitive environment of the older age groups. A number of the least experienced players took to the court for their first taste of basketball. The U12s were all at sea in the first quarter and allowed UL to dominate. The girls were much improved for the rest of the game with bright performances by Elisha Noonan, Melissa Do and Julina Ryan. Our U13s found life very tough against UL and know that they have a lot of work to do in training over the next few weeks if they are to improve. Our U14 and U16 girls are in action in two weeks time in the Cork league against Ballincollig and Midleton respectively.

Both our U14 and U16 girls got their Cork League campaign for the new season off to a winning start against Ballincollig.

Our U14 girls proved much too strong for Ballincollig in their game. The result was all but sealed after a dominant first quarter performance where our girls opened up a 15-2 lead. Ballincollig had the better of the second quarter winning it 6-3. However our girls moved up the gears in the second half scoring 16 points in both quarters to ease to a 50-21 win.

The U16 game was a much more competitive affair although our girls always held the edge. They won the first quarter 11-5 and followed up in the second quarter outscoring Ballincollig 11-6 to lead at the interval 22-11. Isabelle Meaney had her best game for St Colms, getting a number of steals which led directly to scores.

The girls were boosted by the news that Orla Zundel returned to light training and should be back playing by the end of the month.

Top scorers for St Colms were Aoife Morrissey 21, Amy Higgins 6 and Jody O' Halloran 6.

Our Senior Saints played their first North Munster league game of the new season but went down to Newport on a scoreline of 23-35. The team is much changed from last season with Emily Kavanagh and Ruth Butler moving from last year's Scholars team and Michelle Walsh and Liona Carroll making their debuts for the club. There was certainly a period of adjustment early in the game which Newport exploited opening up an early 8-0 lead. The Saints grew slowly into the game but were not clinical enough when it came to putting points on the board. However there were plenty of positive signs in the game which bodes well for the rest of the season.

Next time our U14 and U16 girls travel to Midleton for Cork league games. Our Senior Scholars host UL Huskies while our U10 and U12 girls play Glen Cruisers in the North Munster League.

Our U16 girls continued their impressive start to the season recording their second win in the Cork League away to Midleton. The girls were the better team early in the game and established a first quarter lead of 10-5.
