The girls were included in a very tough pool that comprised last year's winners and strong favourites for this season's title, Brunel from Cork. The other teams were Dublin's top side DCU Mercy, Galway's sole representative Titans as well as a second Dublin team Tolka Rovers.

4 teams were playing for the second qualifying spot, as in truth Brunel are simply a class apart from any other team in Ireland. As expected Brunel easily topped the pool with 4 comfortable wins.

The girls started the weekend with a game against Tolka Rovers. The first quarter was an edgy affair with both teams slow to settle. The girls played exceptionally well over the weekend, and with all bar one of the players underage again next season, hopes will be high that the girls will make the
