The second quarter was another tight affair with little separating the sides as Brunell eked out a slender 21-17 lead. The third quarter opened with a big three pointer from Brunell which rocked our girls back on their heels. The girls kept their heads up, worked hard but some mistakes attributable in the main, to fatigue, allowed Brunell some easy scores. All of a sudden Brunell led 34-21 going into the final quarter.

Brunell, who are a terrific team and the benchmark for our girls, worked tirelessly in the final quarter to maintain their lead and ran out deserving winners on a 46-31 scoreline.

There were huge positives to be taken from the 4 games played. The girls showed in their displays, that they will be a force to be reckoned with during the coming season.
